 RADM Kevin Kovacich, USN**

**With great enthusiasm and excitement, we invite you to attend a highly unusual event—a local presentation by an active duty Admiral! Rear Admiral Kevin Kovacich**, who is a Naval Flight Officer and son of our Spokane Chapter members Vince and Harriet Kovacich, will speak to us at a luncheon at noon on Friday, 18 May 2012 at Valley Hospital. Admiral Kovacich is currently the Associate Director, Assessment Division, OPNAV (N81D) in Washington, D.C. He recently completed a year as Deputy Director, Current Operations (J3) as part of United States Forces – Iraq in Baghdad. He will address the current status of the U.S. Navy, future needs, and planning to meet changing threat environments. Guests are welcome.

Admiral Kovacich's previous assignments include USS Midway (CV 41), Attack Squadron( VA) 128, Carrier Group One, and Fighter Squadron (VF) 213. He also served as Executive officer of Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 122 and Commanding Officer of VF-211. His staff tours include Air Force Command and Staff College in Montgomery, Alabama, where he earned a Master of Political Science from Auburn University at Montgomery; Armed Forces Inaugural Committee; Joint Staff Operations Directorate, Counter Narcotics Division; Executive Assistant to the Director Assessment Division, and Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Requirements; faculty member with the Industrial College of the Armed Forces; and Deputy Director of Chief of Naval Operations Strategic Alignment Branch Head Naval Warfare Integration Group (N00X).

### COLONEL SPADY KOYAMA JROTC SCHOLARSHIP

Local Junior ROTC administrators have expressed great satisfaction over our new scholarship that the Spokane Chapter is offering to their cadets. It will be awarded to recipients at the annual award ceremony at each of the four high schools. Funds will be paid to the school where they are enrolled. To date, we've received enough cash or pledges to support a scholarship of \$300 for each school.

The Board of Directors wanted to name the scholarship in honor of a past member of our chapter who had served our country in time of war and had been a leader in our chapter. So they chose Colonel Spady Koyama, U.S. Army (Ret.), who was a Charter Member of the chapter. He was our first Secretary and he also served as chapter President from 1983-1985. Additionally, he was President of the Washington State Council of Chapters from 1985-1989. He passed away on 18 March 2006.

Spady was born in Ferry County, Washington in 1917 of Japanese parents. His father died when he was five years old, so his mother sent him to Japan to live with relatives for six years. He then returned and attended Lewis and Clark High School, graduating in 1937. When Pearl Harbor was attacked, his mother told him he should be fighting for his country. However, when he tried to enlist at the Spokane Army recruiting office he was initially rejected because he looked like the enemy. So he went home and returned the next day, when he was finally accepted. He offered the Army a unique capability in that he could speak and write fluent Japanese. In 1944, Spady was part of the Philippine invasion when his LST was hit by a kamikaze bomber. He was badly injured and left for dead until someone saw his arm move. In 1947 the Pentagon sent a letter asking him to return to active duty. Once again, his mother's influence played a part and she told him that General MacArthur still needed him. So he said "yes." He went on to interrogate Japanese prisoners of war at MacArthur's headquarters and eventually retired as a Colonel. Spady later met a number of people who had been prisoners of the United States. They expressed their appreciation for kind treatment by all Americans, especially Spady.
